

GREG WINDSPERGER

- 1951 Born on December 30, in Minneapolis, MN.
- 1969 Minnesota High School State Champion Ski Jumping
- 1970 Placed 6th in NCAA Ski Jumping Championships
- 1972 Alternate to Olympic Ski Jumping Team, placing 5th.
- World Championships in Falun, Sweden; and 1976 Innsbruck Olympics where his best finish was 34th on the normal hill. He retired after the Olympics, moving to Marquette, MI and Northern Michigan University to finish a business degree.
- 1976 Coached the Northern Michigan Ski Jumping team and in his first year, his team won the ski Jumping title at the NCAA Championships. The US Nordic Program Director, Jim Page, called and asked Greg if he would coach the US Nordic team whose prospects looked slim and slimmer.
- Team finished 6th in the 1982 Oslo FIS World Championships ahead of powerhouses Japan, West Germany and Czechoslovakia.
- Team almost had a medal result, with a 4th place finish by Jeff Hastings on the large hill at the Olympics in Sarajevo.
- 1985 Team had a world distance record in Planica, Yugoslavia and an amazing 5th in the Innsbruck FIS World Championships ahead of Norway. The US has not seen results like these either before or since his tenure. He has done more for the sport of ski jumping in the US than any other American.
