

GORDON WREN

Born in 1919 and raised in Steamboat Springs, CO, known as "the greatest all-around American skier." He was the only American to ever qualify for all four events in the Winter Olympics. Coached many juniors to win 20 Divisional Championships and 8 National Titles.

- 1927 First competitive jump at age eight, winning all but three of the 75 meets he entered until age 17.
- 1942-45 Instructor with the 10th Mountain Division in the US Army.
- 1948 Member of the U.S. Olympic team; won fifth place in the special jumping event. Set jumping hill records this same season in Switzerland at Arosa, St. Moritz, and Davos.
 - First jumper to break the 300 foot mark in America.
 - Received the Ashby Award for service to junior skiing; the Halstead Trophy for service to Colorado skiing.
- 1950 Member of the F.I.S. Jumping Team; was the US Nordic Combined Champion; received Second place in the National Giant Slalom competition.
- 1950-1954 Steamboat Springs Winter Sports Club's Coach having great influence on many accomplished skiers.
- 1955 Recreational Director in Reno, NV, over 1400 youngsters, the world's largest ski training program.
- 1959 Awarded the Russell Wilder Award by the National Ski Assoc. for furthering junior skiing in America.
