

William "Bill" Mahre

- Began ski jumping in 1950. Wally Wakefield, a good friend, was quoted after his death, "He was never more than a mediocre ski jumper, but he became much more than most St Paul Ski Club members have ever become."
- Joined the St Paul Ski Club in 1957 and served as a member of the Board of Directors until his death in 2015
- President of the St Paul Ski Club for three terms: 1974, 1975, and 1976
- Co-chairman of the St Paul Ski Club's bingo operations for 15 years which resulted in the ski club becoming financially independent and enabled the club to provide outstanding Nordic facilities at their current ski jumping site in Maplewood, Minnesota.
- Involved in securing a long-term lease with a cellular telecommunications company for the use of the of the current Harrington Hill Ski Jump as a cell tower.
- He and John Lyons were the first inductees into the St Paul Ski Club Hall of fame. The Hall of Fame is named the "John Lyons and Bill Mahre Hall of Fame" named after the pair.
- Served 11 years as Secretary-Treasurer for the USSA Central Division Ski Jumping Committee.
- Served three years as Chairman of the USSA Central Division Ski Jumping Committee.
- Served as Central Division Representative on the National Ski Jumping Committee.
- Served three years as Chairman of the National Ski Jumping Committee.
- Served as the Ski Jumping Delegate on the USSA Olympic Committee from 1973 through 1988.
- Attended numerous National USSA Annual Meetings from Lake Placid, New York to Sun Valley, Idaho to Snowmass, Colorado, to New Orleans, Louisiana
- He was the Chief of Start for the ski jumping events during the 1980 Olympics in Lake Placid, New York.
- Active in the development of the Minnesota Holmenkollen Project to bring a world class ski jumping venue to Minneapolis, Minnesota.
- Served as a member of the American Ski Jumping Hall of Fame Selection Committee.
- He was a distinguished representative of the St Paul Ski Club to the sport of ski jumping on a local, national, and international level throughout the tenure of his membership.
